

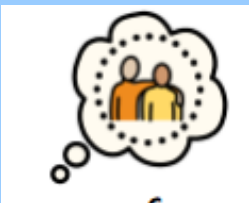


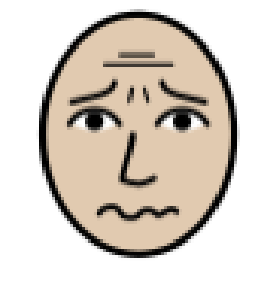
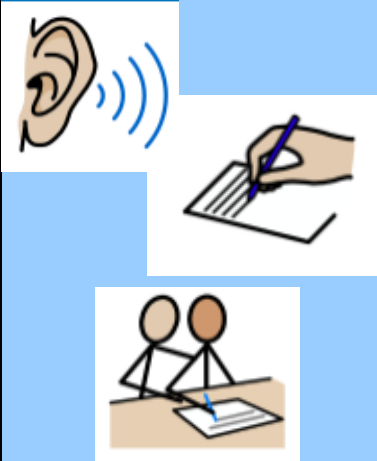

Child Protection Policy

We want everyone to feel safe, happy and listened to at The Gateway. This policy explains your rights, who you can talk to and what we do to keep you safe.

What is our school promise to you? 	Our school promise is: • We care about you and take your safety and happiness seriously. • We will listen and help if you have any worries. • We will respect you and treat you fairly. • We keep you safe and make sure you are ok.
What are your 'rights' at school? 	You have the right to: • learn • feel safe • be respected • be listened to • share our thoughts and feelings, • be treated with kindness and honesty, • to be healthy
What does 'keeping safe' mean? 	Being safe means: • staying where you should be • following the golden rules • not hurting others • using things responsibly • telling an adult if there's a problem, • making sensible choices at school, online, and outside.

Who can you talk to if you feel worried? 	We can talk to a trusted adult, such as: • Our class teacher or class teaching assistant • Mr Cassem or Miss Warner or Mrs Rafter • A play leader who will tell an adult • Our parents or guardians • Our friends when we need help sharing our feelings.
How can you share a worry with an adult? 	We can share a worry by: • talking to a trusted adult or family member • asking to speak privately to a class adult • writing it down • drawing a picture • leaving a note for the teacher • showing our feelings, • telling a friend who can help us share it.
What will happen when you share your worry with an adult? 	• the adult will always make time to listen. • they will make a note of what you have told them to make sure they remember your words correctly. • depending on what the worry is the adult may need to speak to Mr Cassem, Miss Warner or Mrs Rafter to help keep you safe. • we will decide how best to help you e.g. talking with your parent/carer • getting more help from people outside of school (only if needed to keep you safe). • we will check back with and keep supporting you.
How do we keep you safe online and offline? 	We stay safe online and offline by: • asking an adult for permission • not talking to strangers • keeping personal information private • following safety rules • telling an adult if something goes wrong • learning about safety in lessons like computing and Jigsaw.
